Wednesday, June 17 at 2:30 p.m.

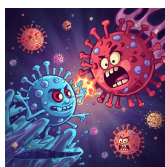

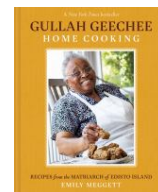


Bingo!

Monday, June 29 at 1 p.m.

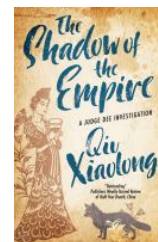
