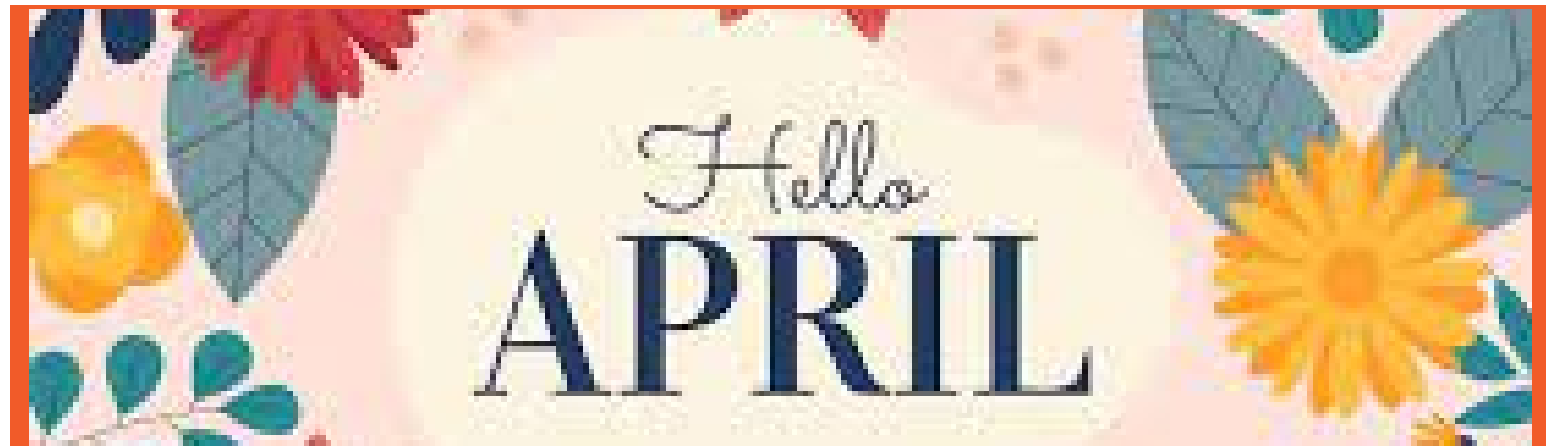

### VITA Tax Help

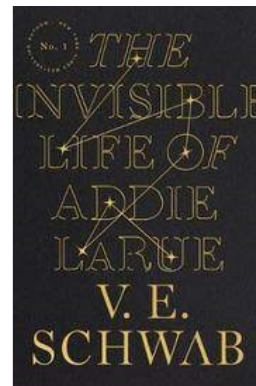

Wednesday, April 17, from 2-3 p.m.

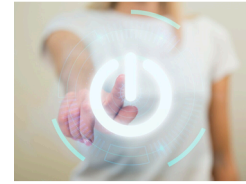
Wanting to learn more about protecting yourself from cybercrime? Join us for a presentation led by the Columbia FBI Field Office. A short Q&A will follow the presentation.
