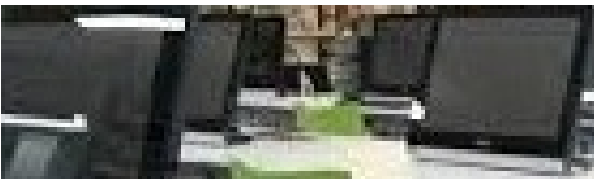

**Monday, Jan. 22, from 10-11 a.m.**

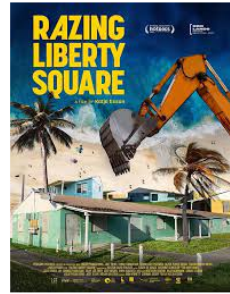
Join other seniors to learn what's happening at Mount Pleasant Library while you enjoy good coffee, good conversation and a morning treat.
