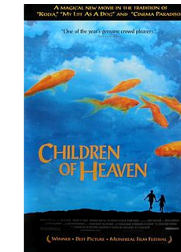
Tech Help: Book a Librarian

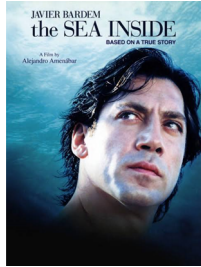


Saturday Afternoon Foreign Language Movie

from 10 a.m.-12 p.m.

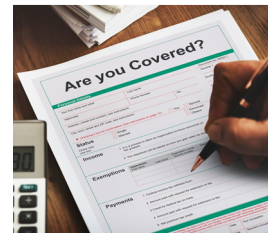
